

This year has been a year where restrictions, due to COVID-19, have reduced and in the most part have now been fully removed from school life. We end the school year very differently then the last two previous academic years, and all for the better! As I have said in previous communications, the resilience and determination of our school community, and most importantly the children of our school is something to be extremely proud of!

This term has seen, once again, our curriculum come to life and inspire our children to be great thinkers, doers and believers. Children in school have been learning all about Metacognition and how we should also work in our stretch zone – children know that at times they might go into their danger zone but we are learning about how we can come back to the stretch zone by using our Sharples Learning Pit. Ask your child all about it.





Outcomes for learning have been more and more impressive, as children pull together their learning from across the last year. Staff have worked incredibly hard to bring together learning, showcases, productions and experiences that last a lifetime for our children.

It has also been remarkably heartwarming to see parents, carers and extended family members back in school, this is something that we will continue to build on next year.

Assessment has taken place for all our children with statutory national assessment for children in Y1 Phonics, Y2 KS1 SATS, Y4 Times Table Check and Y6 KS2 SATS. We have had absolutely fantastic results from all our children but especially Year 6. The governors and I are so proud of the children, staff and parents of Sharples because these results really do show the great strides we have made in the toughest of circumstances.

We say good-bye and good luck to our amazing Year 6 class who have been fantastic role models for the younger children and had a fantastic attitude towards their learning this year. We know you will continue to do everyone proud as you enter the next stage of your education journey.

Just a reminder if you are replacing school uniform over the holidays of the school agreed uniform policy. We will also be starting the process of introducing a new PE hoodie and these will be phased in.
