The price of a school meal will increase to £2.47 per day (£12.35 per week) from next term. `Please inform the office before the end of summer term if you wish to change the current lunch arrangements for your child.

Important Note

From September 2023, all children will be required to wear the purple PE top when it is their PE day. These will be available to try on and order each Monday, Wednesday and Friday for the next week in the school hall from 8.30-8.45am and 3.15-3.30pm. Usual prices are £16 for child sizes and £19 for adults. School will subsidise all orders received and paid for by Friday, 7 July, reducing the cost to £12 and £15.
