There are also lots of fun things for you to do outside. Asher and Alfie are having fun exploring the garden.



What if I am hungry or thirsty?

You can have a healthy snack from our snack table whenever you feel hungry. You can have fruit or vegetables to eat and milk to drink. Muhammed has chosen a juicy apple, and Asher is eating a carrot.

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"I like apples," says Muhammed. "I will try a carrot next snack time."

What happens if I need the toilet?

The toilets are in our classroom, so they are easy to find. If you are working with a teacher, you should ask before you go to the toilet.

"Yes, Asher, you can go. Thank you for asking so politely," says the teacher.



Asher flushed the toilet after she finished. Now she washes her hands with soap and water to clean away the germs.

"I'm glad I practised going to the toilet all by myself before I started school," she says.

Have you practised going to the toilet by yourself?

If you need help or have a toilet accident, don't worry. Tell your teacher, and they will help you.

Your grown-ups will bring in some clean clothes for you if you need to change.

What happens at the end of the day?

You will get your coat and bag, then sit down on the carpet with your teacher. We will chat about our day, or listen to the teacher reading a story.

The children love the story that the teacher is reading to them.

"Why do you think the boy in the story feels happy?" she asks.

When it is time to go home, you will go to the door. When your teacher sees your grown-up, they will call your name and you can go.

"Goodbye, Asher. I'm looking forward to seeing you tomorrow," says the teacher.
