Transitions and School Leavers

Once again, the staff team have worked their magic, ensuring that all the children across school had a positive transition experience in their new class. The teachers, support assistant and cohorts of children loved working together and produced some wonderful work and made some great memories. The year 6 class all had positive experiences with their own secondary school transitions. It is safe to say that all the children have an excellent secondary experience ahead of them.

Nursery had their very own assembly where the children celebrated their nursery journey in readiness for school. It was great to see how mature and prepared they are for the new school year. Not all our pre-school children will move to Sharples reception class, however they have all had a fantastic transition, meeting with their new class members and teachers.

New School Members

I am thrilled to welcome some new children into Nursery, Reception, Year 3 and Year 5. Starting a new school can bring many differing emotions to the surface. I am really confident that all our newbies will love our school and look forward to returning every day. The children across school are fantastic at supporting our new arrivals and working together to make them feel right at home. In the first couple of weeks of the new term, parents and carers will be welcome to visit their child's class and view their learning environment, work and meet their child's class teacher.

Parking and Walking to School

Please can I also remind children that road network around school at pick up and drop off times are extremely busy. Staff are present to provide additional support regarding traffic and safe transition into the school premises.

Parents are responsible for making the decision for the children to either walk by their side, or run a head. Allowing children to run ahead and cross the road independently, especially for our younger aged pupils is of huge concern around these busy collections and drop off times.

School Uniform

Our expectations for the next academic year continue to remain high for all children and I would like to thank you on ensuring your child comes to school in the correct uniform. Following national work around the cost of uniforms, the Governing Body will be reviewing our uniform requirements next year, we do have the option of non-badged jumpers and polo shirts. When the children are wearing shorts, these can be a fitted or a relaxed fit but must be a length at mid-thigh down to their knee. Some children, particularly girls, are wearing shorts that are significantly higher that mid-thigh and on some occasions not noticeable due to their jumper hanging low.
