Dear Parents/ Guardians,

The children's work will displayed before and after school on Tuesday in our Sharples Gallery for parents to walk around.

As we continue to enter spring we know we can have weather from all the seasons. When we come back after the holiday, we are going to try and use the field more so children need to keep a named pair of wellies in school. We are also going to open our new adventure trail – further details to follow. I have included our agreed uniform policy in case your child has grown and you are needing to replace in the holidays:

Dark grey school style trousers, dress or skirt, Purple polo shirt, Purple sweatshirt/cardigan with the school logo or a plain purple jumper/cardigan, Black shoes no boots or open toe sandals Hair accessories should be small and purple or black Head scarves black or grey Lilac purple and white summer school dresses.

Children are allowed to wear non-uniform when it is their birthday or on a day nearer to their birthday if it falls on a weekend or school holiday.

Children should have suitable clothing for P.E. or Games. They need a purple T-shirt, black shorts and trainers. We are noticing an increasing amount of children wearing AstroTurf shoes – these are not safe and should not be

work in school. If your child does not have the school purple zip up they should wear their school jumper. School has new plain purple t shirts and summer dresses in stock at a reduced cost.

We do have a few pre loved school jumpers and black zip up tops which we ask for a nominal donation for. If you are interested please ring the school office.



We do not have space to accommodate back packs and ask that children bring their books in the school reading pack.

Assessments

Just a reminder the National Assessments will be taking place this year.

Children in Year 1 will have their phonics test, Year 4 multiplication check and Year 6 National end of Primary school SATS.

Year 6 SATS will take place week commencing Monday 13^{8h} May.

Year 1 phonics will take place week commencing Monday 10th June

Year 4 Multiplication Check week commencing 3rd June

All other children will have the summer term NFER tests.
